Our Mission

The Friends of Monroe County Public Library support the mission, vision, and values of the Library. The Friends advocate for Monroe County Public Library and support library collections, services, programs, and staff development.

Our Commitment

For 51 years, the Friends of the Library has raised funds to help the Library provide a wide range of opportunities for lifelong learning, enrichment, and enjoyment for everyone in the community. In 2016, 696 families and businesses made contributions to the Friends. As of December 31, 2016, 418 individuals. families, and businesses were members of the Friends of the Library, including 67 new members. In addition, Friends and community members made 463 donations to the Campaign for Excellence, and 112 general donations to the Friends.

Campaign for Excellence

Thanks to the generosity of 463 people, and a matching grant from a bequest from Carol R. Nicholas, the 2016 Campaign for Excellence raised a record total of \$85,752 including some gifts received early in 2017. The 2016 Campaign will fund a variety of books, supplies, and programming for children, teens, and adults at the Main Library, Ellettsville Branch, and Bookmobile. The Campaign provides funding for Math Homework Help, extra funds for Outreach Services like Head Start and Camp Yes, as well as volunteer recognition items and staff professional development. Special thanks to our honorary co-chairs, John and Audrey McCluskey, who value how the Library nourishes their family and our community, and who shared their enthusiasm to make this Campaign the most successful ever, assuring that our Library remains a dynamic center for literacy, reading, and enjoyment for all ages in our community.

Our Library

In 2016 there were 986,663 visits to our Library (Main Library, Ellettsville Branch and Bookmobile) with a circulation of 2,559,992 items. Downloadable items account for 16% of total circulation. The Library had 72,519 cardholders, provided 1,783 programs to 58,893 people, and 171,147 public computer sessions. Volunteers donated 12,865 hours of their time including staffing the Sendak exhibit. 1,334 meetings were held at the Library by 270 nonprofits and organizations. The Friends of the Library provided program funding, materials, prizes, and more to enhance patrons' visits. The Library received the Indiana Library Federation's Programming Award for *The Power of* Words: March with John Lewis, Andrew Aydin, and Nate Powell in recognition of the breadth of programming offered and engagement of community partners.
