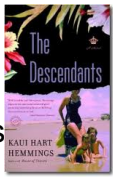


From Book to Best Picture

The Descendants by Kauai Hart Hemmings

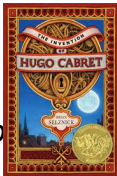
