Come by with the kids at 3 p.m. Sunday to join in the fun, learn from seasoned gardeners, and get messy! [Read more](#)

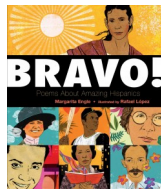

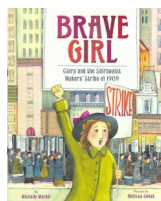

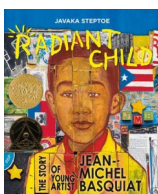
