Users can access more than 400 databases, 43,000 e-journals, and 224,000 e-books, as well as locally developed digital content. All IU libraries are open to residents of the state as well as to IU faculty and students.

Monroe County Community School Corporation (MCCSC), located in south central Indiana, is a dynamic community with broad diversity in cultures, religions, ethnic groups, and socioeconomic levels. This diversity and the school community's commitment to quality education have made the MCCSC an educational leader in Indiana for the past thirty-five years.

Monroe County Public Library enriches individual lives and strengthens our community by offering equitable access to information and opportunities for literacy, learning, and enjoyment. We aspire to be a dynamic library, essential to thoughtful, productive community life, and always meeting our community's evolving needs.

WFHB is Indiana's original community radio station, broadcasting an eclectic mix of music and news on four different FM frequencies and online. WFHB has recently started a new program for banned books called Books Unbound.
