We Are Marshall

This historical drama describes the aftermath of the 1970 plane crash that killed 37 football players on the Marshall University Thundering Herd football teams, the rebuilding of the football programs and the healing of the community.

The team deals with several racial clashes, while the school board tells Boone that if he loses even one game he will lose his job as well. This leads to an undefeated season, which is threatened right before the semi-finals when it is apparent the referees are intentionally calling a bad game.

Rudy dreams of playing football for Notre Dame even though his grades aren't good enough to get into the school and he lacks the stature or talent necessary to play in such a prestigious program and instead goes to work in a steel mill. **Phil Everly** (January 19, 1939 ? January 3, 2014)

Phil Everly was one half of the Everly Brothers. 'Bye Bye Love' in 1957 brought them fame and resulted in 15 Top 10 hits between 1957 and 1962. In 1986 the Everly Brothers were among the first 10 artists inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.

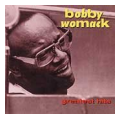

**Pete Seeger** (May 3, 1919 ? January 27, 2014)

Pete Seeger was a folk singer and social activist. His best known songs are 'Where Have All the Flowers Gone?' and 'If I Had a Hammer (The Hammer Song)'. He was one of the

folksingers most responsible for popularizing "We Shall Overcome" during the Civil Rights Movement.

**Bobby Womack** (March 4, 1944-June 27, 2014)

This singer-songwriter began his career as a child with his brothers in Curtis Womack and the Womack brothers. Sam Cooke signed the group to his label, and after some success with the newly named Valentinos, Womack played backing musician for Cooke. Womack also wrote the Rolling Stones' first UK number one hit "It's All Over Now".

**Tommy Ramone** (January 29, 1949 - July 11, 2014)

The last surviving member of the influential punk band The Ramones died July 11, 2014. Born in Hungary as Erdelyi Tamas, Tommy Ramone was a founding member and drummer of the Ramones famous for the songs "I Wanna Be Sedated" and "Blitzkrieg Bop". He played on the band's first three studio albums before leaving the Ramones to concentrate on studio work.

**Jack Bruce** (14 May 1943 - 25 October 2014)

Jack Bruce was Scottish musician and composer considered by many to be one of the greatest bass players of all times. Best known for his work in the band Cream, Bruce also had a successful solo career and occasionally performed in Ringo Starr's All-Star Band.

**Wayne Static** (November 4, 1965 - November 1, 2014)

Born Wayne Richard Wells, Wayne Static is best known as the spikey haired lead vocalist of metal band Static X. Formed in 1994, Static X released six studio albums. In 2011 Wayne Static pursued a solo career and released the album Pighammer.

**Bobby Keys** (December 18, 1943 - December 2, 2014)

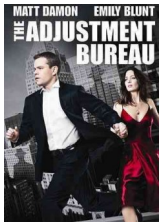
December began with the loss of the Saxophonist and Rolling Stones sideman Bobby Keys. A longtime friend of Keith Richards, Keys toured and played with the Rolling Stones for 40 years. His career spanned four decades and he appears on albums by Lynyrd Skynyrd, George Harrison and Joe Cocker among other prominent musicians.

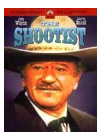

## The Shootist

A while ago I wrote about one of my favorite John Wayne Movies, *The Quiet Man*. *The Quiet Man* was a romance and a departure from the War and Western films that John Wayne was most well known for. My second favorite John Wayne film, *The Shootist* is also a departure from his usual role even though it is a western, it is the story of an older gunfighter now battling a greater battle; cancer. Seeking a place to spend his last days, he takes up residence in a boarding house run by a widow who is against everything the gunfighter's life represents while her teenage son harbors a secret desire to be just like the old shootist .

The cast for *The Shootist* is among the best. Besides 'The Duke' as the shootist J.B. Books, the film features Lauren Bacall as boarding house owner Bond Rodgers and Ron Howard as her son Gillom. Despite the film's title you won't find a lot of shoot outs in the film. It's the story a

dying man, who wants to die with dignity and perhaps regain a little taste of the life he could have had if his life had not taken the violent turn it did. Yes, John Wayne is still the tough guy, but his view is now tempered as he faces his cancer and the knowledge that there is nothing he can do to win his battle against it. Each character must in the end examine themselves as they are faced with Books? mortality and eventual death.

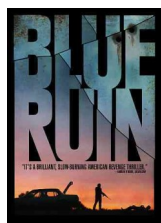
