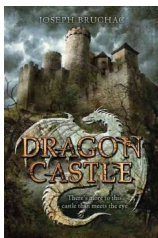

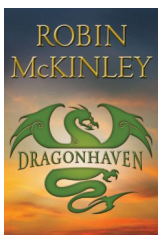


Dragon Castle

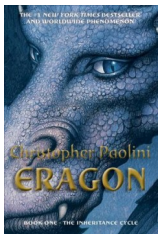

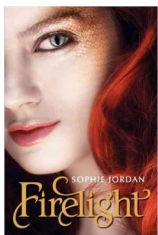


Eragon

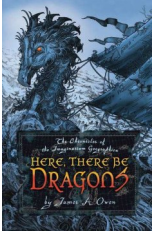


Firelight

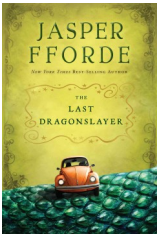


Here, There be Dragons

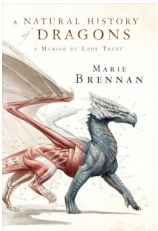


The Last Dragonslayer

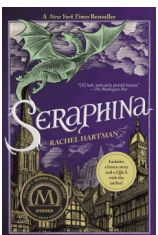

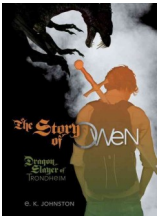


Seraphina

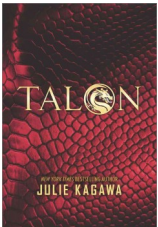

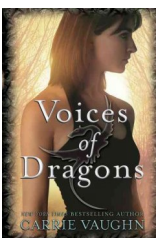


Talon
